Tour of the State Capitol

Group Tours

Public Tours

Small groups of a few students and educators may elect to join one of the public tours:

A free 60-minute guided tour is available to visitors. Tours begin at the Tour Information Desk which is located on the second floor of the Legislative Building, just inside the main entrance doors. Tours are available on a first-come, first-served basis and is limited to groups of 25 or fewer per tour time.

Meeting with Legislator(s)

Please contact your legislators directly if you would like to schedule an afternoon meeting with them. During session, meetings with legislators are scheduled for 15 minutes and take place in their offices on the Capitol Campus.

Some legislators may be able to schedule a photo with your group in their office, or possibly on the Senate or House floor depending on the schedule that day. This can be coordinated through each legislator's Legislative Assistant.

• Attend Afternoon Hearings or Floor Action

During session, Senate and House Committees hold hearings on bills. WSNA will provide the committee schedule for the day of Advocacy Camp when it is available in January. Sitting in on a hearing is a great way to see the legislative process in action. If there are no hearings scheduled

when you are there, legislators may be running bills on the floor of the Senate and/or House. Viewing floor action is another good experience. Seating is available in galleries on the fourth floor of the Legislative Building.
