Payroll deduction (upon contract ratification)

By choosing this option, I authorize my employer to deduct an amount as certified by WSNA as the current amount of the WSNA dues from my earnings each year, according to the employer's payroll deduction period, beginning with the payroll period following contract ratification and automatically renewing for successive yearly or applicable contract periods.
