September was a busy month for your Seattle Children's Hospital WSNA officers, and we want to share our work representing the nurses at SCH. We met with a state representative and presented yet another letter to Bonnie advocating for commitments to safety - primarily around staffing and workplace environment. Keep reading for more information, and see how you can get involved.

- 1. On September 18th, your WSNA officer group from Seattle Children's along with unit representatives from PBMU and PICU met with the WA state congressperson Liz Berry to share our concerns with the current state of short staffing and workplace safety. Liz Berry is the chair of the Labor and Workplace Standards Committee for the state congress, and is a powerful and influential ally. WSNA, our officers and Rep Berry are partnering to elevate the issues we face and are working together to keep hospitals accountable to the health of their workers and the patients we serve. More to come, but this is an exciting avenue to explore for our nurses and nurse advocacy.
- 2. On September 29th, the WSNA officer group for Seattle Children's Hospital met with Bonnie Fryzlewicz (CNO) and Holly Beauchene (HR leadership) to present a formal letter of ongoing concerns unmet and unresolved by the leadership of the hospital. Attached is the letter and the action items requested of our leaders. We are awaiting a response from Bonnie and Holly at our next NCC meeting on Wednesday, 10/18. Inaction from executive leadership is not an acceptable response for the sake of our nurses and the patients we serve. If inaction is, in fact, the response they choose, then escalated responses from our WSNA nurses should be expected. Please continue to fill out ADOs as you face issues of short staffing and workplace safety concerns. Your reporting adds voices to our power with actions moving forward.
